Tewkesbury

An area behind Queens Road by the Priors Park Nature Reserve is being transformed into a community edible garden. A big thank you to all the volunteers from Lloyds TSB for helping us get up and growing. We currently have 6 raised beds planted with a broad range of vegetables and herbs. Community members are welcome to join us every Wednesday from 4-6pm.

Cheltenham

Our community edible garden in Clevedon Square is now up and growing as well, thanks to the help from a volunteer day with Barnett and Waddingham. We have four veg plots, a fruit boarder and a herb circle that also features a three sisters (sweetcorn, climbing beans and winter squash) plot. We are inviting the residents of Clevedon Square and other close by Cheltenham Borough Homes residents to participate and grow with us.

Cirencester

In partnership with Cirencester Town Council, we are offering giant grow bags (large building supply bags) filled with compost to residents to then act as grow bag guardians. We are looking for people that live in an area that has a large grass verge or cul-de-sac. The bags will be placed on the grass and maintained by grow bag guardians. Guardians will be supplied with plants, seeds, water butts and on going support. We will also be keeping a plot at the City Bank Allotments for practical training. Rio 20+ has been and gone with little to show for it and it can only be credited as yet another badly missed opportunity. With eleven of the past twelve years being the hottest on record and distinct changes to both global and local weather patterns, it really doesn't take much to recognise the potential gravity of the situation and the threat it poses.

Twenty years ago, when the visible effects of climate change were only just beginning to show themselves, there was a tremendous upsurge in the need to take a more sustainable approach to living and the consumption of natural resources. At that time, many Governments, NGO's and individuals took the

message on board and took the initiative to help resolve the two major threats to life on this planet, which are Climate Change and Population Control.

The world has moved on since then and, although much has been achieved, there is still much more to do and it has to be done at a much faster rate. The spurious debate around whether Climate Change is a natural or man made phenomenon has impinged progress and serves only to deflect attention from the real problems at hand, i.e. the fact that Climate Change is happening, the world's population has exceeded 7 billion and it is predicted to exceed 9 billion by 2050.

No matter what we do, there is no doubt that over the next 100 years, the climate is going to change. The world will become hotter and resources will become scarcer.
