Transition Lunch on Fridays!

As part of the Transition Town Cheltenham initiative, to reduce dependence on non-renewable resources, George's Organic Cafe (10 Bennington St, next to Tesco Metro on the lower High St) have been holding a weekly Transition Lunch each Friday from 12.30pm until 2pm. As intensive meat production is heavily dependent on oil, their Transition Lunches have been entirely vegetarian. The menu varies from week to week, depending on what's in season. Menus are priced at £4 for a main course, and if you have the main course, soup and a pudding are £1 each. A recent menu was: parsnip, cheese & rosemary soup, followed by great nut pie with potatoes boulangere & braised leeks, with rhubarb & lemon tart to follow.
